Includes: Operations (baseline goals), Clinical (baseline goals), and Racial Equity/Social Determinants (priority goals). Board packet contained breakdown of goals report by specific tasks. Major Highlights/Updates: Special Populations proposals were received on 15-February. For the clinical access and equity goals, significant work was reported on the value based payment (VBP) system and the Star Rating System (SRS) with the Cultural Competence Advisory Council. Presentation: Attorney Gino Serra - Bryan Cave Leighton Paisner Law	G.Thompson	G.Thompson introduced Gino Serra to speak about Board of Trustees Training topics. G.Serra suggested to Board that this initial discussion will be to gauge what Board Training topics the Board want to focus on, for how long, et cetera. G.Serra mentioned bringing to the CMHF Board best practices from other non-profits; to see how that knowledge and those practices can be leveraged to the benefit of the CMHF Board. G.Serra provided a list of topics to the Board that could be included in the future Board Training sessions. Discussion included interest in what to look for in financial statements and audits. K.Williams recommended her recent orientation in her new role as Treasurer. B.Eddy referenced the highlights provided with each financial statement as a place to begin, invited questions, and offered an orientation to interested Trustees. T.Cummings volunteered to create an online survey to gauge Board interest in the topics.	information		
Cultural Competence Advisory Council (CCAC) Update	G.Thompson	G.Thompson reported that the CCAC met on 23-Feb-2022. Discussions within the CCAC included how to integrate the rollout of the Star Rating System, especially the rollout of SRS technical assistance. T.Cummings reported that CCAC decided on how technical assistance applications will be reviewed and which CMHF agencies would be receiving technical assistance. The next CCAC meeting will be on 23-Mar.	information		
Value-Based Payment (VBP) Committee Update	<b>G</b> .Thompson	G Thompson reported the University of Michigan has been looking at value-based payment for the last 17 years. UM is hosting a 4 hour session on 23-March- 2022 entitled 'Enhancing Health Equity': During this live webcast, "a broad range of healthcare stakeholders from across the nation will address the  opportunities and challenges regarding strategies to reduce health care disparities and enhance equity, expanding the role of Value-based insurance design in  Medicare and the CMS Innovation Center strategy refresh, progress in measuring and reducing the use of low-value care, and the advances in pre-deductible  coverage for high-value services used to prevent and treat chronic conditions" (VBidCenter.org). Registration is free. G.Thompson reported that with Cohort 3 of the Value Based Payment, there are 10 agencies left to enter the value based payment initiative (six agencies probably ready to enter). Out of the 31 CMHF agencies, 27 agencies are going to be engaged with the value-based pay. T.Cummings reported that we're moving  forward with Cohort 3 and starting the key performance indicator (KPI) training, and over the course of the next year, all of the CMHF agencies will be assigned  to their incentive level. For the agencies that are not participating in VBP yet, they! Iremain at the Basic level unliter training has started and are readying to  get their KPI's in place. G.Thompson moved that CMHF Board moves forward with Cohort 3 of Value Based Payment as planned. T.Cummings reported to  Board a refresher of the VBP levels: 1, 2, 3, and Pilot Agencies. In March 2022, the recommendation for the incentive payments for Cohorts 1 and 2 will be  coming forward. The value based payment scoring will be done as follows for Year 2, Cohort 1 agencies: Reporting will be up to 10 points, Learning Rapid Cycle  up to 40 points, Executive Rapid Cycle up to 30 points, and Identification of mission-critical KPI's for Dashboard will be up to 20 points.
